

World Forum The Hague – Privacy Statement

1. Introduction

World Forum The Hague (hereinafter referred to as “World Forum”) strives to ensure that the personal data of its customers and visitors is processed and protected with the utmost care. World Forum complies with the requirements of the General Data Protection Regulation and other privacy legislation. The data controller is World Forum The Hague, Churchillplein 10, 2517 JW The Hague, Netherlands.

2. Processing of personal data

World Forum processes personal data in order to provide its services, such as when you subscribe to our newsletter, register your interest with us, or otherwise contact World Forum. This concerns contact details such as your name, email address and language preference. World Forum will use this information to perform its agreement with you, to provide other services, to conduct its internal operations, and to keep customers up to date on new and existing products and services from World Forum. Your data will not be passed on to third parties or transmitted to countries outside the European Union without your explicit permission. If you no longer wish to be contacted after providing your consent, you can unsubscribe at any time.

3. Retention periods

Your personal data will not be stored for any longer than is required by World Forum to comply with its legal obligations, to perform its agreement with you, to provide other services to you or to keep you up to date on new and existing products and services from World Forum if you have opted in to our newsletter.

4. Unsubscribing

If you do not wish to receive information by email about new and existing products and services, you can unsubscribe at any time by clicking the unsubscribe link in the email. 5. Rectifying your data

World Forum allows you to have your data rectified or erased. In addition, you can object to the use of your data. The changes will be applied from the newsletter following receipt of your request.

6. Click behaviour and IP address

The World Forum website collects data about general visit information, without identifying visitors individually. This is done using analytical cookies, which are designed to optimise the layout of the website. This data can also be used to provide more targeted information on the website and allow World Forum to further optimise the services it provides to you. World Forum also uses your computer's IP address for the same purpose. An IP address is a number that is automatically assigned to your computer when you use the internet. It can be used to identify how the website is used and to enable analyses and reports to be generated. An IP address can be classed as personal data, in which case your IP address will be processed by us in accordance with this Privacy Statement.
